Written by John Mark, the young companion of Peter and Paul. (Ac 12:12, 25; 13:5, 13; 15: Col 4:10; 2 Tim 4:11; Phm 24; 1 Pt 5:13; cp Mk 14:51). He accompanied Paul and Barnabas when they returned to Antioch from Jerusalem (Ac12:25) and on their first missionary journey (Ac 13:5). He wrote primarily to Gentile Christians in the Roman Empire probably between 64-68 AD.- Bible Notes

Vs. 1- Mark begins by claiming right off the bat that Jesus is the

Vs. 21-28- Not your average church service! Who came into the synagogue while Jesus was teaching?

What does he say to Jesus?

I'm sure the church attendees this day had their heads on a swivel anticipating Jesus' reply! What does Jesus do?

How did people respond to Jesus?

Vs. 29-34- Healings begin! Who did Jesus heal at Simon and Andrew's house?

Word travels fast! Many other sick and possessed people were brought to him as well. What did He prohibit the demons from doing and why?

Vs. 35- What can we learn from Christ's example here?

Vs. 38- Jesus clarifies why He had come. What does He say?

Vs. 40-45- Jesus heals a man with a skin disease. How does Jesus approach him?

Once healed, what does He instruct the man to do?

Vs. 45- What did the healed man do, and what effect did that have on Jesus' ministry?

(Bible Notes: By law this man with a serious skin disease (Gk *lepros*) was required to wear torn clothes, let his hair be unkempt, and then cry out, "Unclean!" to warn people to stay away from him (see Lv 13:45-46). Mark notes that Jesus was *moved with compassion*.)

(Bible Notes- There is a strong, almost universal tradition that Levi and Matthew are one and the same (see parallel account in Mt 9:9). Some have suggested that Levi was his given name and Matthew (meaning "gift of God") was the name he was given when he became an apostle. Name changes often accompanied dramatic changes in life. Levi was a tax collector for Herod Antipas, the tetrarch of Galilee, and was despised by the Jews.)

Vs. 15-17- Dining with sinners. Who hosted the dinner?

Here come the Pharisees and scribes again. What is their issue with this dinner party?

(Bible Notes- The Pharisees or "separated ones" were developers of what came to be known as the oral tradition (the *Talmud and Mishnah*). They were the official interpreters of the Law. They were very legalistic and obsessed with observing the Sabbath in certain ways and performing rituals.)

(Bible Notes- With the reactions of Jesus' family presented as bookends surrounding the hostility of the scribes, the skepticism of Jesus' own biological family was seen more clearly. Members of His own family said, "He's out of His mind," revealing how little His family understood Him (v. 21).

Vs. 26-29- (Bible Notes- The parable of the secretly growing seed, which is unique to Mark, had to do with the mysterious way the kingdom of God grows. All a farmer could do was plant the seed. He would not understand how the seed grows.) What is the meaning of the Parable of the Growing Seed (Mark 4:26-29)? | GotQuestions.org

Vs. 30-32- (Bible Notes- The kingdom of God was like the mustard seed because the kingdom, too, appeared weak and insignificant in the beginning. But in the end its size and significance would exceed what would be expected at the beginning.) What is the meaning of the Parable of the Mustard Seed? | GotQuestions.org

(Bible Notes: These 3 parables concerned spiritual perception of the message of the kingdom and the specific growth of the kingdom. The kingdom was to be revealed, not hidden. It may have appeared weak and insignificant in the beginning, but in the end its size and significance would exceed expectations.)



(Bible Notes- Apart from Jesus' resurrection, the feeding of the 5,000 was the only miracle recorded in all four Gospels (Mt. 14:13-21; Lk 9:12-17; Jn 6:5-13). The numbering was based on counting the men. Adding women and children would have greatly increased the number.)



Vs. 27- (Bible Notes- Jesus' first response to her at a glance seemed uncharacteristically harsh. However, Jesus was neither indifferent nor insensitive; rather, He wanted to test the faith of this Gentile woman and use her faith as a testimony to the disciples. The Jews often referred to the Gentiles as 'dogs', but here the reference is a diminutive form, meaning small dogs kept as household pets rather than scavengers of the streets."
Vs. 28-30- Knowing she was not from the chosen lineage of the Jews, she admits that she would accept even "crumbs" of His help. What does Jesus say and do?

Vs. 22-26- Another private healing. Who is healed, how, and what does Jesus instruct him to do?
Vs. 27-30- Jesus questions the disciples again. What does He ask?

Who did others think He was?
Jesus warned them to tell no one. Why?
(Bible Notes- Contrary to what some modern scholars have said, the fact that Jesus hesitated to reveal Himself as Messiah early in His ministry does not mean He did not believe Himself to be the Messiah. He clearly accepted the title as expressing His true connection to the Old Testament and to the people of God (8:29).
Vs. 31-33- What is Jesus preparing them for?
Peter did not want to hear Jesus speaking about such things. He rebukes Jesus, but then Jesus explains to him that "you're not thinking about concerns, but".
God sees the big picture. We must pray for God's perspective on things that are difficult. Jesus didn't ask for comfort. He sought God's will.
Vs. 34-38- Powerful verses! What does Jesus charge His followers to do?

Chapter 9:

Vs. 1- (Bible Notes: Jesus was saying some, but not all, standing there would witness the transfiguration. More than anything these words offered encouragement and anticipation for the coming kingdom). Was Jesus' statement that "some who are standing here will not taste death" in Luke 9:27 (also Matthew 16:28; Mark 9:1) incorrect? | GotQuestions.org

Vs. 2-13- The Transfiguration: Who went with Jesus up the mountain?

Describe what happened:

(Bible Notes: Truths were illuminated through this extraordinary event!

- 1. Jesus was the fulfillment of the Law (represented by Moses) and of the prophets (represented by Elijah).
- 2. Jesus prefigured the glory that would be His at the time of His return.
- 3. All believers are represented. Moses represents those who had died and been buried, Dt. 34:5-6; Elijah was translated without dying and represents those who remain alive at the time of Christ's return, 2 King 2:11.
- 4. This event demonstrates beyond doubt that Jesus was more than He appeared to be (i.e., God in human flesh).
- 5. The Transfiguration was also meant for the spiritual training of those who were with Him)

What do you think Peter was thinking based on his comment in vs. 5-6?

Vs. 7- God appears in a ______. What does He say?

Vs. 9-10- Based on this conversation, how were the disciples feeling?

Vs. 11-13- (Bible Notes- Jesus' words, *Elijah really has come* (vs. 13), referred to John the Baptist who "will go before Him in the spirit and power of Elijah" (Lk 1:17), thus fulfilling the prophecy of the forerunner who was to prepare the way for Messiah (see Is 40:3; Mal 3:1-2; 4:5).

(Bible Notes: Jesus stresses that the destructive nature of evil demanded a radical offensive action. He was certainly not calling for mutilation of the body, rather, He was emphasizing the necessity of avoiding eternal punishment or jeopardizing one's right standing with God whatever the cost).

Vs. 44, 46, and 48- Based off these quotes from Isaiah 66:24, is hell a literal place?

So, we see why Jesus had such passion for people, leading to His commitment to go to the cross. He made a way to heaven and relationship with Him for all who follow and love Him.

Chapter 10:

Vs. 1-2- As Jesus teaches a crowd, the Pharisees approach Him with a question. What do they ask Him?

(Bible Notes- Jesus leveled the ground between husband and wife in the arena of marital commitment (10-12). Jesus again went beyond the Jewish religious leaders because He acknowledged that for a man to commit infidelity against his wife made him an adulterer as well. The moral obligation within the marriage covenant in the teachings of Jesus was the same for husband and wife. Jesus even recognized the right of a wife to divorce her husband, which had not been allowed in Judaism. Jesus lifted the discussion beyond Mosaic law to God's original plan at creation. God intended for one man and one woman to become inseparably one being, mirroring the unity within the Godhead (Gn 1:27). Indeed, Jesus condemned all divorce, whether by husband or wife, as being contrary to His plan.)

Vs. 13-16- Jesus makes two things clear in these verses. First, who does He want to be allowed to come to Him? ______ Second, he uses the children as an example of the kind of faith He wants from all of us. What does He say?

(Bible Notes: He emphasizes a child-like faith, in which dependence upon the Lord was mandated over self-reliant trust in one's personal strength and ability)

Vs. 17-22- The rich young ruler: This young man was very proud of his accomplishments and possessions. He could check off quite a list of religious deeds. But what does Jesus ask him to do?

Jesus goes to the heart of the matter: in whom or in what does the man put his trust?

Vs. 23- What powerful statement does Jesus make?

Vs. 24-25- They are astonished at this comment, so He doubles down. What does He say?

(Bible Notes- The unique way in which Jesus entered the city combined hints of His messiahship as the Son of David. Moreover, He was the fulfillment of prophecy, and He brought deliverance, although not in the political ways the people envisioned. This entry was humble and lowly as prophesied (Zch 9:9) and stands in contrast to His victorious return to usher in His kingdom (Rv 19:11).
Vs. 7-10- They brought Him the donkey, and he began to ride into town. How did the people greet Him?
How do they refer to Him?
Vs. 15-16- The next day they go to the temple and what does Jesus do and why?
Vs. 17- He quotes Scripture and reminds them of the purpose of the temple. What does He say? (Read Jeremiah 9:9)

Vs. 53-65- Jesus is taken to the Sanhedrin:

Vs. 53- Who all was convened for this event late at night? Vs. 54- Who followed the mob and Jesus into the high priest's courtyard? (Bible Notes: Flogging and scourging, a barbaric and senseless cruel punishment in which the victim was stripped to the waist with his hands bound to a stationary pole while he was mercilessly whipped. The whip itself was a torturous instrument consisting of a handle with attached leather throngs weighted with jagged pieces of bone and rock. The victim was most assuredly disfigured and often died from this ordeal.)
Vs. 16-20- The brutal Roman soldiers mock and demean Him. What kinds of things did they do?


