





He prays for deliverance and deems the help of human beings worthless. Only God could bring the deliverance for which the poet longed. This psalm, like those immediately preceding it, celebrates God's faithful love.)

| (Bible Notes- The initial setting of this psalm may have been the occasion when David brought the ark of the covenant to Jerusalem (2 Sm 6:12), where it was viewed as a visible sign that the Lord had established His throne there. When Jesus cited a portion of this psalm, He referred to David as the speaker (Mt 22:41-46). The hymn is messianic since its words were fulfilled in Jesus Christ.) |

(Bible Notes- In this battle scene, the Lord has been variously viewed as either Yahweh or the Messiah, effecting God's final judgment on the world.)

(Bible Notes- The imagery suggests that the hero pauses to drink at a brook he crossed. Refreshed, he then presses on to total victory. Ultimately that hero is the Messiah. The early church recognized the messianic character of this psalm. The New Testament itself frequently refers or alludes to Ps 110 in relation to Christ (e.g., Mt 22:44; Ac 2:34-35; 1 Co 15:25; Heb 1:13; 5:6; 6:20; 7:17; 8:1; 10:12-13). The psalm is a testimony to the faith of God's people. The psalm's original setting as celebrating God's divinely appointed king came to full fruition when Jesus of Nazareth was identified as the Messiah-King. God has indeed set Jesus at His right hand. To Christ alone has been given power and authority, an authority demonstrated by sacrificial love. Jesus is both our great High Priest and King).

(Bible Notes- Psalm 111 is a good example of a Hebrew acrostic poem. Each of its 22 lines begins with a successive letter of the Hebrew alphabet.)

| (Bible Notes- This psalm is also an acrostic poem that contrasts the blessings of the righteous with the fate of the wicked (Ps 1). Most of the verses of this poem elaborate on the blessing that belongs to upright people. The emphasis falls on the dependable or stable character of the person living in right relationship with the Lord (vv 6-8). Such an individual will persevere in doing good even in life's testing times (Jms 1:6-8). |

Psalm 113: Praise to the Merciful God

(Bible Notes- In Jewish tradition, Pss 113-118 are known as the *Hallel*. These psalms are sung in the morning services of the major Jewish feasts and holy days: on the day of Passover sacrifice; at the Festival of Weeks (Pentecost); on each of the eight days of Festival of Booths; on each of the eight days of the dedication of the temple. In addition, they are sung on the night of the Passover meal. Pss 113-114 are sung before the meal and Pss 115-118 are sung after the meal. According to some, Pss 113-116 are to be recited or sung after the *Haggadah* (Hb, "telling"), the Passover liturgy recounting the story of the redemption of Israel from Egypt, and Pss 117-118 after the meal (see Mt 26:30).

(Bible Notes- Psalm 114 celebrates God's mighty acts of deliverance on behalf of His people. God delivered His people from bondage in Egypt. The designations *house of Jacob* and *Judah* are alternate ways of referring to Israel. The Lord parted the sea as His people came out of Egypt and also parted the Jordon River when they entered the promised land. He provided water for His children during their wanderings in the wilderness. Nature reverently and joyfully participated in these acts of the Lord (vv 4-6). God's majestic presence should still prompt His people to tremble in awe before Him (vs 7).



(Bible Notes- Psalm 119 is the longest poem in the book of Psalms and the longest chapter in the Bible. An acrostic poem, each of the psalm's 22 stanzas begins with a successive letter of the Hebrew alphabet, and the first word of each line in a stanza begins with that particular letter—a technique that can be observed only in the Hebrew text. Notice that the Hebrew letter along with its name is printed at the beginning of each stanza. The theme of celebrating God's law is readily apparent in the poet's use of eight terms for the law, which appear in almost every verse of the psalm).








(Bible Notes- The final stanza of this psalm constitutes a plea for deliverance in order that the psalmist might praise the Lord (vs. 175; cp. 51:14-15). He, however, had nothing to offer but a cry and a plea. His words reflect a posture of total dependency on the Lord. His appeal for understanding expresses his desire to know God's Word and to discern how to respond to his present difficulties in a manner that reflected his faith in the Lord. In faith the psalmist anticipates joyfully expressing thanks for the Lord's answer to his prayer. God's hand represents His power to deliver His children. This stanza reiterates a common theme of the entire poemfaithfulness to God's Word).

Psalm 120: A Cry for Truth and Peace

(Bible Notes- This collection of 15 pilgrim psalms is called the Songs of Ascents or the Songs of Degrees. Although the songs of ascents may not have originally been composed for the purpose of being sung by pilgrims on their way to Jerusalem, they probably were also sung by worshipers as they went up to the holy city to celebrate the great festivals each year. Some scholars believe the psalms were sung as the pilgrims actually ascended the steps of the temple itself. Some of the individual psalms reflect other purposes, but as a collection they accurately reflect not only the journey of the pilgrim to Jerusalem but also progression in the Christan life. In addition, these psalms constitute a major part of what are known as the *Great Hallel* psalms (Pss 120-136).

Psalm 126: Zion's Restoration

(Bible Notes- The psalmist focuses on the joyful return of the exiles from captivity in Babylon as permitted by the decree of Cyrus, king of Persia, in 539-538 B.C. (see Ezra 1:1-4). In this song of ascents, the psalmist encouraged God's people to persevere, despite the new adversities they encountered, know that better days lay ahead (cp Ps 85).

(Bible Notes- This is the only song of ascents connected with Solomon (cp Ps 72). Solomonic can mean "to Solomon", "for Solomon", or "by Solomon". It conveys the sense of "belonging to" Solomon either in the sense of authorship or of this psalm belonging to his collection).

Psalm 128: Blessings for Those Who Fear God

(Bible Notes- The shared themes of Ps 127 and 128 invite readers to view them as a pair. Psalm 128 declares the blessings of everyone who fears the Lord. 

Psalm 129: Protection of the Oppressed

(Bible Notes- In this song of ascents, the people of Israel recall those who had afflicted them in the past. God's people had suffered repeatedly at the hands of their enemies, and God again and again had delivered His people (cp. 124:1-2).

(Bible Notes- The worshipers are reminded of David's desire to build a house for the Lord (2 Sm 7:1-2). This psalm may have been composed specifically to celebrate the bringing of the ark to Jerusalem (see 2 Sm 6:12-19). The title *Mighty One of Jacob* signifies the grace the Lord had shown to Jacob in guiding, protecting, and blessing the patriarch (Gn 49:24; 2 Sm 7:1). The plea for the lord to remember David is a cry for the Lord to act favorably in keeping with His covenant with David).

(Bible Notes- David's commitment to the Lord led him to determine to bring the ark of the covenant to Jerusalem and have a temple built to serve as its dwelling place. David is concerned for the Lord's presence with His people. The bringing of the ark to Jerusalem ushered in a new era of God's rule over His people. The Lord's footstool was a reference to the ark, which represented God's rule on earth. The psalmist prays, on behalf of His servant David, that the Lord will not reject His anointed one (i.e., Solomon, who carried out David's dream of building the temple) or one of the kings of Judah).

Vs. 11-12- What was the oath the Lord swore to David?

(Bible Notes- God promised that one of David's descendants would occupy the throne forever (2 Sm 7:8-17; 1 Ch 17:11-14). The king and his descendants were held responsibility to keep the covenant by walking in obedience to the Lord. Since He always keeps all of His promises, the oath He swore to David would, without question, be fulfilled. The life, death, and resurrection of Jesus the anointed one is the supreme fulfillment of the Davidic covenant (see 1 Kg 8:24-25; Lk 1:32; Heb 12:2; Rv 3:21).



(Bible Notes- This imprecatory portion of the psalm is particularly challenging to interpret. The psalmist desired the Lord to bring judgment on the Babylonians, who had destroyed Jerusalem and taken the people of Judah captive while the Edomites, Judah's neighbor to the south, had celebrated the defeat and participated in the city's destruction. The Lord had promised retribution on both oppressors (regarding Babylon, see Is 13:1-22; 47: 1-15; Jr 50:1-51:58; regarding the Edomites, see Ezk 25:12-14; 35:2-15; Jl 3:19; Am 1:11; Ob 10-14). The psalmist wants the Lord to fulfill judgment already prophesied against Israel's enemies, who also opposed God Himself (Is 13;16; Hs 13:16). The severity of these statements reflect the psalmist's righteous zeal in wanting to see justice served in a manner equivalent to what harm had been done to Israel).

was in the cave, referring to the time when David was being pursued by Saul and hid in a cave at Adullam (1 Sm. 22: 1,4) or at En-gedi (1 Sm. 24:1-22). Vs. 1-3- What is David doing and why? 
