# Book 4 of Psalms: (Chapters 90-106)

Psalm 90: Eternal God and Mortal Man – A prayer for Moses, the man of God (Bible Notes- This psalm, which marks the beginning of Book IV of the Psalter, is the only one associated with Moses). Vs. 1- "Lord, You have been our in every generation". Refuge definition- a condition of being safe or sheltered from pursuit, danger, or trouble. Vs. 2- What does this beautiful verse tell us about God? Vs. 3-6- These verses paint a picture of human life with respect to an eternal God. Explain: Vs. 3-Vs. 4-Vs. 5-6-(Bible Notes- The psalmist contrasts the eternal nature of God with the frail nature of humanity. As Go from eternity to eternity, He existed before the creation of the earth. The brevity of human life is compared with the short0lived grass that flourishes and dies within a single day. Only faith in the eternal God can make life meaningful (2 Pt 3:8). Vs. 7- What is the psalmist expressing? Vs. 8- What has caused God's anger? Vs. 9-10- The psalmist feels as if their days are ebbing away under God's wrath. What does he say is a typical life span? He says, "Even the best of them (years) are \_\_\_\_\_ and ". He also says, "they pass and we fly away".

#### **Psalm 92: God's Love and Faithfulness**

(Bible Notes- The stupid person or fool does not acknowledge the Lord's magnificent works. Fool refers to an obstinate individual who has a pattern of making wrong choices in life. Such a path leads to destruction).

(Bible Notes- God's people experience stability in Him. The righteous are pictured as healthy and fruitful trees, flourishing like the palm tree and becoming strong like a cedar tree in Lebanon. Both trees portray strength and stability. The righteous- those in right relationship with the Lord- continue to be fruitful and vigorous even in old age, resulting from God's blessing).

#### Psalm 93: God's Eternal Reign

(Bible Notes- This psalm is one celebrating the eternal kingship of the Lord (Pss 47; 96-99). Such poems focus on the majestic Lord as sovereign over all His creation).

(Bible Notes- The powerful waters of the sea were feared by pagan peoples in ancient times. Yet the poet affirms that the Lord is greater than these mighty waters. The Old Testament emphasis on God the creator stands in stark contrast to the pagan teachings of chaotic and random happenings).

Vs. 5- What does he mean when he says God's testimonies are completely reliable?

(Bible Notes- Not only God's creation but also His testimonies or statutes are firmly established and are completely reliable, representative of His covenant relationship with His people. Thus, believers are eternally secure in their relationship with the Lord).



classified as an enthronement psalm, celebrating God's kingship (Pss 47; 93; 97-99). These psalms are characterized by the phrase "the Lord reigns").

The audience is also instructed to tremble before Him in recognition of His awesome majesty, an aspect of worship that is often neglected today. The eternal reign of God, the primary focus of this psalm, is not only an objective fact to be mentally acknowledged but also demands a lifestyle of personal submission to His rule (cp. Php 2:9-11).





(Bible Notes- God's eternity stands in stark contrast to humanity's brief life span. God's power is totally opposite to human frailty. The poet's confidence lies in the Lord's eternal sovereignty. Even in his own agony, the poet could look beyond himself to see God's plan, which transcended his own lifetime. God would show favor on His people).
Vs. 18-22- Thinking beyond himself and his current circumstances, what does he say?

(Bible Notes- The psalmist views his agony in terms of God's eternity. God, who laid the foundations of the earth, would endure even after those foundations were destroyed. The earth

changes, but God remains eternally the same (cp. Heb 1:10-12). Recognizing God's eternal presence gives a new perspective on life. It brings life into proper focus).

#### **Psalm 103: The Forgiving God**

(Bible Notes- God is a compassionate and tender Father toward His children. He knows that He created you from the dust of the earth (Gn 2:7). The Lord has compassion upon human frailty. In contrast to your weakness and the brevity of your life, God's love is everlasting and unchanging. All those who take His covenant seriously and live by faith in obedience to His instructions experience the wonderful reality of His unchanging love. The fear of the Lord described in this passage does not refer to a cringing mistrust of His goodness but rather to the reverent obedience that grows out of a recognition of His awesome nature and faithful love).


